

How to Turn on and Use Guided Access

Guided access is an accessibility feature used to limit access to only the app that is running and can be used to limit which part of the webpage students can access. After you've enable guided access mode in settings, you can activate it at in any app by pressing the home button three times. Once you're in guided access mode, you can tap the home button three times to exit.

Enabling Guided Access

1. From the **Settings** app go to **General** and then to **Accessibility**.



2. Under the **Learning** section, tap on **Guided Access**. Toggle Guided Access to “On” and choose a passcode. This passcode is unique to guided access. Remember the code you use as you will need to enter it again to get out of Guided Access.

Using Guided Access

3. Start the app you want the student to use.
4. Triple-tap the home button to bring up the **Accessibility** menu.
5. Then select **Guided Access** to turn it on.
6. Optionally, circle areas of the screen you would like to disable



7. Or turn off Touch and/or Motion (portrait/landscape).
8. When finished, tap Start. Guided Access is now enabled.
9. To exit Guided Access, triple-tap the Home button, and enter your four-digit passcode.

Disabling guided access mode:



10. From **Settings**, go to **General** and then to **Accessibility**. Under the **Learning** section, tap on **Guided Access**. Toggle Guided Access to “Off” and enter the passcode you chose before.

NOTE: If you forget the guided access passcode, you can regain access to the device by rebooting it. When you're in guided access mode, the home button is disabled, but you can reach the settings after a hard reboot. Press the home and power button for at least fifteen seconds to reboot.
